Governments around the world are attempting to balance the need for promoting trade and mitigating the risks that such dual-use items can be diverted in-country or re-exported for unauthorized uses. As such, most countries – including India and all its major trading partners – are instituting mandatory *licensing* requirements for acquisition, manufacture and trade in such items – with an aim to ensure adequate security along the entire transnational production and supply-chain.
