About the Conference

India has the one of largest road network across the world, spanning over a total of 5.5 million km. Road transportation has gradually increased over the years with the improvement in connectivity between cities, towns and villages in the country. In India sales of automobiles and movement of freight by roads is growing at a rapid rate.

The combination of constant increase in the number of road vehicles and the subsequent rise in traffic volumes and axle loads speed up developments like congestion, wear and tear of structures and, last but not least, air pollution and noise emissions.
