# Pradhan urges GST Council to bring petroleum products under its purview

Petroleum, Natural Gas and Steel Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has urged Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council to bring petroleum products under GST purview as early as possible. Currently, petroleum products attract central excise duty and value added tax (VAT) levied by states.

In an exclusive interview with ANI, Pradhan said: "From day one I have been urging GST Council to bring petroleum under GST purview. We are continuously urging the council and today again I am requesting GST Council to consider our demand." Pradhan's appeal came amid petrol and diesel prices hitting a record high in the national capital on Tuesday after a temporary pause on the upward trend. While the price of petrol was increased by 25 paise, diesel rate jumped up by 35 paise. The hike took the petrol price in Delhi to Rs 90.83 per litre and diesel rate climbed to Rs 81.32 per litre.

#### Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs approves construction of 56,368 houses under PMAY-U

Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has approved construction of 56,368 houses under PMAY-U at Central Sanctioning and Monitoring Committee Meeting. These houses are proposed to be constructed under various verticals of PMAY-U Mission. "Let's get into the mode of implementation and execution," said Durga Shanker Mishra, Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA). Mishra urged the States/UTs to ensure 100% completion and delivery of PMAY-U houses to all its eligible beneficiaries within the mission period. The participating States/UTs were also directed to use the online mechanism (MIS) for proper implementation and monitoring of the Mission. The progress of Light House Projects (LHPs) and Demonstration Housing Projects (DHPs) was also reviewed by Secretary, MoHUA.

#### New Covid variants detected in Maharashtra, Kerala not behind surge: Govt

Two variants of SARS-CoV-2 -- N440K and E484K -- have been detected in Maharashtra and Kerala but there is no reason to believe presently that they are responsible for the surge in cases in some districts in these two states, the Centre said on Tuesday. Addressing a press conference here, NITI Aayog Member (Health) V K Paul said that 187 people have tested positive for the UK strain of SARS-CoV-2 in the country so far, while six people have detected with the South Africa variant. Also, one person has tested positive for the Brazil variant strain.

Both the N440K and E484K variants of SARS-CoV-2 have been detected in Maharashtra. In Kerala and Telangana also these variants have been found. Also, three others -- UK, South Africa and Brazil variants are there in the country. But there is no reason for us to believe that they are responsible for the upsurge of the outbreak in some districts of Maharashtra and Kerala, Paul said.

# Punjab orders fresh curbs on indoor, outdoor gatherings as Covid cases rise

The Punjab government on Tuesday ordered curbs on both indoor and outdoor gatherings from March 1 and authorised deputy commissioners (DCs) to impose night-curfew in COVID-19 hotspots in their districts if needed. Chairing a virtual review meeting of the COVID-19 situation in Punjab, Chief Minister Amarinder Singh issued orders to limit indoor gatherings to 100 people and outdoor events to 200 attendees from March 1, an official statement said. He also directed that face masks and social distancing norms be strictly enforced, it said.

The move comes amid growing concerns over an upswing in the number of coronavirus cases in the state. Singh authorised DCs to adopt micro-containment strategies and impose night-curfews in COVID-19 hotspots if needed, and directed the police to ensure that people wear masks.

## India's GDP may turn positive at 1.3 pc in December quarter: Report

India's GDP may turn positive at 1.3 per cent in the third quarter of 2020-21, having witnessed contraction in the previous two quarters due to the coronavirus pandemic, as the number of cases is falling and public spending has started rising, according to a report. The government will release the GDP numbers for the October-December quarter of the current fiscal on Friday. Projecting that the gross domestic product (GDP) may have returned to the black in the last quarter of the calendar year 2020, DBS Bank in the report said the full-year growth in real terms may be at a negative 6.8 per cent. DBS Group Research economist Radhika Rao said sharp improvement in the COVID-19 situation and rising public spending are the two factors that bode well for December 2020 quarter. India posted degrowth of 24 per cent and 7.5 per cent in GDP in first and second quarters ended June and September 2020, respectively.

#### India's recovery has entered the consolidation phase since January: ICRA

India's economic recovery has entered a consolidation phase during the first month of 2021, as the pace of improvement in a number of leading indicators slowed down compared to December, according to rating agency ICRA. The annual performance of about nine of the 15 indicators tracked by ICRA weakened compared to the improvements seen in December on account of a fading of the favourable base effect, supply-side issues and price hikes, the agency said in a report on Tuesday. ## Govt's skill upgrade programme for unskilled labourers under MGNREGA fails to take off

The government's skill upgrade programme for unskilled labourers under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee scheme labourers has failed to take off. Official data showed that of target of 1.012 lakh candidates for training in the current fiscal under Unnati project, barely 4% or 4,181 candidates were trained as on January 20, 2021. Under project Unnati, the ministry of rural development had planned to train one adult member, between 18 and 45 years, per household who had completed 100 days of work under MGNREGA in the previous financial year. It had aimed to train two lakh candidates between 2019 and 2022 at an estimated cost of over Rs 300 crore.

#### SBI joins JPMorgan's blockchain-based payment network

State Bank of India has tied up with JPMorgan to use the US bank's blockchain technology to speed up overseas transactions. The tie up is expected to reduce SBI customers' transaction costs and time taken for payments, sources said. Time taken to resolve cross-border payments-related inquiries can be reduced to a few hours from up to a fortnight, they said. This will help cross-border payments reach beneficiaries faster and using limited steps. "We have undergone significant digital transformation in recent years and continue to add new technologies to create real value to daily operations," said Venkat Nageswar, deputy MD – international banking group, SBI. ## Stress in retail loans of banks may triple by FY22 end: Ind-Ra

Stress in retail loans could triple by the end of FY22 due to a slowdown in income growth and slower pace of job creation in the service sector, credit ratings firm India Ratings & Research (Ind-Ra) said. It estimated that stressed loans from retail advances could rise to 4.7% of the total in March 2022 from 1.60% in March 2021, led by slippages in unsecured loans — especially at private sector banks. Jindal Haria, director Ind-Ra, said private sector banks are likely to experience higher slippages from retail loans with total stressed loans increasing about three times, mainly due to their share in unsecured loans. Despite the rise in stressed loans, retail will continue to drive credit growth for banks with a 15% to 20% growth next fiscal due to consumer demand for buying homes and vehicles even as banks tighten their credit appraisal process.

## India's electronic makers gear up for a blockbuster launch season

India's top smartphone and consumer electronics makers said they are gearing the highest number of new product launches this year in four years as supply of components have improved and are almost back to pre-Covid levels. LG, Samsung, Xiaomi, Panasonic, Realme, Vivo and Godrej Appliances are all planning one of the highest numbers of new model launches this year, company and industry executives said. New launches took a backseat last year due to poor component supplies owing to global surge in demand for electronics that neither the companies nor component makers could forecast. Containers from China were getting held up with Indian custom authorities in ports and airports for scrutiny after border clashes and a fiscal quarter was lost due to lockdown and overall innovation pipeline slowing down due to the pandemic.

We in the Ministry of Textiles are looking at the next two years to ensure that India is self-reliant in the space of silk," she said.

# Indian pharmaceutical firms go local for APIs, seeking to end reliance on China

Indian drug companies are looking to local makers of so-called active pharmaceutical ingredients (API) or trying to make them in-house in a bid to end their reliance on China as ties between the two countries soured after a deadly border clash last June. Though India is known as the pharmacy of the world for its massive production capacities of both generic drugs and vaccines, China accounted for half of its API needs in 2019 from nearly nothing three decades ago, industry data shows. Executives at India's Cadila Healthcare, Cipla, Sun Pharmaceutical and Biocon said on Tuesday they were aggressively working on reducing the dependence on the richer rival for raw materials.

# New coronavirus wave causes 35% dip in sales at Asia's largest gold market

The new wave of coronavirus led to a 35% fall in sales in the past week in Mumbai's Zaveri Bazaar, Asia's largest gold market, from where 65% of all gold trading and dealing in India is estimated to originate, said bullion dealers and jewellers. The daily turnover of Zaveri Bazaar is usually close to Rs 900 crore, they said. "Since the number of Covid cases are rising in Maharashtra, people are staying at home and are coming out only when necessary. This has impacted sales at Zaveri Bazaar by 35% in the last one week," Surendra Mehta, national secretary, India Bullion & Jewellers Association, told ET. Amid increasing cases of Covid-19, the state government has imposed strict restrictions on people's movements but stopped short of announcing a lockdown. Restrictions have been imposed across cities such as Amravati, Mumbai, Nagpur, Pune, Pimpri Chinchwad, Nashik, Aurangabad, Thane, Navi Mumbai, Kalyan-Dombivli, Akola, Yavatmal, Washim and Buldhana.

## IT sector continues to see sequential growth in hiring in January: Report

India's IT sector is experiencing a sequential growth in hiring since the lockdown in 2020, witnessing 39 per cent growth in job postings in January compared to the previous month, according to a report.IT sector was followed by BPO (10 per cent growth) and banking (6 per cent), according to the report by job site SCIKEY.Job postings have seen a significant rise in several metro cities, including Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Pune and Delhi, accounting for more than 50 per cent jobs in the sector in January 2021, it added.The report by SCIKEY Market Network has analysed data from over 15,000 job postings across India.

Further, the report revealed that Bengaluru and Hyderabad are the highest paying cities for IT jobs in India for the salary bracket of Rs 25 lakhs or more.

#### Indian media, entertainment to see 27% revenue growth in FY22: Crisil

Indian media and entertainment (M&E) sector is expected to witness a strong 27 per cent growth in revenue to around Rs 1.37 lakh crore in 2021-22, after contracting 26 per cent this fiscal, according to ratings agency Crisil.Segments such as digital and television (TV) will have relatively shorter time to bounce-back to pre-pandemic levels while print, films, outdoor, and radio would take longer.

Crisil Ratings Ltd Director Nitesh Jain said advertisement and subscription revenues contribute nearly equally to the overall M&E sector's topline, but since the former correlates strongly with economic growth, the pandemic has had a bigger impact on it.

# CCI finds no proof of cartelisation among 5 airlines, ends ticket price fixing probe

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has found no evidence of cartelisation among five airlines to fix ticket prices, the regulator said in an order on Monday, concluding an investigation spanning five years. In a suo motu case in 2015, the CCI had ordered a probe into alleged anti-competitive practices after it noticed similar priced tickets being offered on certain routes by carriers like Indigo, state run-Air India, SpiceJet, GoAir and the now defunct-Jet Airways. After two investigations by the CCI's Director General (DG) of four major routes operated by the carriers, the commission agreed with the DG's findings of no evidence for collusion between the airlines.

## Government inks \$304 million loan agreement to improve Assam's power transmission network

The government has signed a loan agreement worth \$304 million with the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) to strengthen Assam's electricity transmission system, the finance ministry said in a statement on Tuesday. The funds will be used to improve the existing power transmission network and build new networks to ensure reliable and affordable power supply in the state, it said. The projects will include the construction of 10 transmission substations and laying transmission lines while another 15 existing substations will be upgraded and existing transmission lines will be converted to optical power wire.

# Petrol nears Rs 91/litre mark in Delhi, above Rs 97 in Mumbai

Petrol price on Tuesday neared the Rs 91 per litre mark in the national capital and diesel crossed Rs 81 a litre, as fuel prices were hiked again after a two-day pause. Petrol and diesel prices were raised by 35 paise per litre each, sending retail rates to an all-time high, according to a price notification of state-owned fuel retailers. The increase pushed petrol price to Rs 90.93 a litre in Delhi and to Rs 97.34 in Mumbai. Diesel - the most consumed fuel in the country now comes for Rs 81.32 a litre in the national capital and for Rs 88.44 in Mumbai. Fuel prices had risen for 12 straight days before hitting a two-day pause button on February 21 and 22.

Shailender Dubey Chairman AIPEF has written a letter to Union Power Minister R K Singh saying that the ministry has circulated the Electricity (Amendment) Bill 2021, to a limited group of State and UT (union territories) Power Secretaries for sending their comments in two weeks.

#### Tamil Nadu will return to double digit growth next year: State admin

Tamil Nadu is expected to register a positive growth rate of 2.02 per cent at 2011-12 constant prices in 2020-21 as against an All India negative growth rate of 7.7 per cent for the current fiscal. Meanwhile, the State has asked the Centre to merge cesses and surcharges with the basic rate of tax so that States receive their legitimate share of revenue. While presenting the interim Budget today, Tamil Nadu Deputy Chief Minister and State Finance Minister, O Panneerselvam, attributed the strongest performance among states to the primary sector, which grew at 5.23 per cent, with the livestock and fisheries sectors faring even better. Growth in the secondary sector is 1.25 per cent and in the services sector it is 1.64 per cent. This significantly better-than-expected growth in 2020-21 is due to the expeditious and effective measures taken by the Tamil Nadu Government to tackle the pandemic, Panneerselvam said.

## Uttarakhand: Covid-19 test mandatory for people arriving from five states

The Uttarakhand government on Tuesday issued an order to make the COVID-19 test mandatory for people coming from Maharashtra, Gujarat, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh in the wake of a surge in coronavirus cases in these states.

"Due to the rise in COVID19 cases in Maharashtra, Gujarat, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, travellers from these states have to undergo testing on arrival in Uttarakhand at state borders, railway stations and Dehradun airport," said Dehradun District Magistrate. The decision was taken in face of a sudden rise in the number of Covid-19 cases in several states. Meanwhile, India on Tuesday registered 10,584 new COVID-19 cases and 78 deaths in the last 24 hours, the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) said.

## 'States have started implementing IMI 3.0 for kids, pregnant woman not immunised in routine drive'

The campaign has exemplified ownership of the immunisation programme by the topmost leadership at the state level also. In Uttar Pradesh, the campaign was inaugurated by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Sunday. It was kicked-off in Rajasthan by state Health Minister Raghu Sharma on Monday.

#### India set to manufacture containers to boost exports

As India aims to boost its exports, the government is looking at manufacturing containers in a big way while developing a shipping line under the Atmanirbhar Bharat programme. Containers are required to ship goods. At present, India is solely dependent on the public sector. While the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways has already set up a committee to study the feasibility of manufacturing containers at Bhavnagar in Gujarat, sources said that other such hubs are also being looked at. Until now, most exporters have been relying primarily on Chinese containers. But with geopolitical contours changing rapidly, shortage of containers has hit exporters, who have had bear the additional burden of freight cost hike. ## Govt starts probe to review anti-dumping duty on steel items from China

The commerce ministry's investigation arm DGTR has initiated a probe to review the need for continuing imposition of anti-dumping duty on certain types of steel products imported from China following complaints from domestic industry, according to a notification.

ISMT Ltd and Jindal Saw Ltd have filed an application before the Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) for sunset review of anti-dumping duty imposed on imports of 'seamless tubes, pipes and hollow profiles of iron, alloy or non-alloy steel from China.

The applicants have alleged that dumping of these products from China has continued even after imposition of antidumping duty, and there has been a significant increase in the volume of imports.

# China back as India's top trade partner even as relations sour

China regained its position as India's top trade partner in 2020, as New Delhi's reliance on imported machines outweighed its efforts to curb commerce with Beijing after a bloody border conflict. Two-way trade between the longstanding economic and strategic rivals stood at \$77.7 billion last year, according to provisional data from India's commerce ministry. Although that was lower than the previous year's \$85.5 billion total, it was enough to make China the largest commercial partner displacing the U.S. -- bilateral trade with whom came in at \$75.9 billion amid muted demand for goods in the middle of a pandemic. While Prime Minister Narendra Modi banned hundreds of Chinese apps, slowed approvals for investments from the neighbor and called for self-reliance after a deadly clash along their disputed Himalayan border, India continues to rely heavily on Chinese-made heavy machinery, telecom equipment and home appliances. As a result, the bilateral trade gap with China was at almost \$40 billion in 2020, making it India's largest.

## Huge export opportunities for apparel players in Colombia: AEPC

Huge business opportunities are present in Colombia for apparel exporters particularly in fashion segment and the domestic industry should explore the areas to boost shipments, AEPC said on Tuesday. The Apparel Export Promotion Council (AEPC) said it has organised 'India-Colombia Synergies in Apparel and Textiles', a virtual meeting platform to explore export opportunities in the South American nation. Quoting Indian ambassador to Colombia Sanjiv Ranjan, it said there is a huge potential for Indian apparel exporters in Colombia, particularly in its fashion industry with domestic sales of about USD 7 billion. "India's apparel exports to Colombia is just 3 per cent of its global imports. This does not really reflect the strength of what our sector stands for. We have a huge untapped potential in this sector which requires to be explored and utilised by our exporters," he said.
