No door-to-door vaccine drive in national policy, Centre tells HC

The Union government on Monday told the Bombay High Court that its national guidelines do not at present allow a door-to-door drive to vaccinate people against COVID-19. The Union government's counsel, Additional Solicitor General Anil Singh, said some state governments and municipal bodies had decided to ignore its advisory guidelines and were conducting door-to-door vaccination for special categories of citizens, but it was not possible yet to make such drives a part of the national policy.

ASG Singh was responding to a previous query posed by a bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice GS Kulkarni on what the Centre thought about the BMC's request seeking its permission to conduct door-to-door vaccination for the elderly, bedridden, or such category of citizens.

Developed nations owe USD 1.1 trillion to developing nations as a part of climate change mitigation under the Paris Agreement, and this was discussed at the G7 Summit, which concluded on Sunday, Javadekar said at the virtual

'Environment Conclave: Revival, Regeneration and Conservation of Nature'. "India's contribution to climate change in the last 200 years is just three per cent. The unbridled carbon emissions particularly by Europe, USA and in the last 40 years by China, caused climate change disaster. These countries prospered economically but polluted the world," he said.

World has to decouple trade policy, green goals: Goyal at UN Trade Forum 2021

Hoping that the developed countries will not use the inter-play of trade and climate challenge "too much", Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Monday said the world should decouple trade policy and its green goals. He also hoped that credit rating agencies and bodies like the IMF "which kind of dictate" the financial architecture of the world do not land up being unfairly harsh on the developing and less-developed countries as this is a time to become compassionate, more liberal and supportive to these nations. "I think a little longer rope needs to be given even to earlier agreements or earlier commitments so that these countries (developing and less developed) have space to bring their economies back on track," Goyal said at the UN Trade Forum 2021. Let the trade policy look for more inclusive growth all over the world and all the countries need to work towards climate justice and sustainable lifestyle. "We do hope that the developed world will not use the inter-play of trade and climate challenge too much because I think trade should allow all countries to prosper. "It should not create trade barriers which will ultimately become a hindrance to taking prosperity to the poorer, lesser developed countries," he said.

DGTR reviewing need for continued imposition of anti-dumping duty on ammonium nitrate from 3 nations

The commerce ministry's investigation arm DGTR has initiated a probe to review the need for continuing imposition of anti-dumping duty on ammonium nitrate imported from Russia, Iran and Georgia, following a complaint from the domestic industry. Smartchem Technologies Ltd has filed an application before the Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) for initiation of a sunset review investigation concerning imports of ammonium nitrate originating in or exported from Russia, Georgia and Iran. The applicant has alleged that expiry of anti-dumping duty on the import of the product from these countries is likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of dumping and injury to the domestic industry. So, it has requested for continuation of the anti-dumping duty levied on the imports, according to a notification of the Directorate.

Sebi tweaks delisting rules to make process transparent, efficient

To enhance transparency and efficiency of the delisting process, Sebi has said independent directors will have to give reasoned recommendation on such proposal, while the promoters need to disclose their intention to delist the firm through an initial public announcement. To give effect to this, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has amended delisting rules, according to a notification dated June 10. This comes after the board of Sebi approved several amendments to delisting norms in March to make the process more transparent and efficient.

May retail inflation at 6-month high of 6.3% on higher food, fuel prices; wholesale price-based inflation soared to a record high of 12.94%

India's retail inflation shot up to six-month high of 6.3 per cent in May, after easing to a three-month low of 4.23 per cent in April, according to the government data released on Monday.Inflation, based on Consumer Price Index (CPI), has breached the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) target range for the first time after five months. The RBI is mandated to maintain the crucial number at 4 per cent in the medium term, with a 2 percentrage point margin on either side as part of its inflation target.Food inflation accelerated to 5.01 per cent in May, as compared to 1.96 per cent in April, while core inflation stood at 6.6 per cent. Within the food items, the rate of fall in vegetables prices was at (-) 1.92 per cent in May, as against (-) 14.18 per cent in the previous month. Meanwhile, the inflation rate in Food and beverages was at 5.24 per cent.

Meanwhile, the wholesale price-based inflation, released earlier during the day, soared to a record high of 12.94 per cent in May, on rising prices of crude oil and manufactured goods. While there were fewer supply chain disruptions during the recent pandemic lockdowns compared with last year, a general rise in inflation globally has elevated domestic price pressures. Higher global commodity prices including including crude, edible oils and gold are clearly spilling over into consumer inflation.

NIBRI jumps to 76 due to revival in mobility indicators

The Nomura India Business Resumption Index (NIBRI) jumped to 76.0 (pre-pandemic level=100) for the week ending 13 June from 67.9 in the previous week. This is 24pp below pre-pandemic levels.. Much of this can be explained by the strong revival in mobility indicators, as States have begun a calibrated reopening, with Google mobility indices, the Apple Driving Index, and daily railway passenger revenues all rising.

GST Council has turned majoritarian, decisions not by consensus: Amit Mitra

West Bengal Finance Minister Amit Mitra on Monday alleged that the GST council has turned majoritarian and decisions were no longer taken on the basis of a consensus as originally envisaged. He also said voices of the Group of Ministers in the council remained unheard. Mitra said that he had tried his best to "raise objections" during the 44th GST Council meeting on Saturday, but the virtual link was snapped at a "critical time". The veteran economist demanded a probe into how and who had "muted" his microphone when the meeting was in progress. "Authoritarianism and majoritarianism have taken over the GST Council... It's most unfortunate, "he told reporters. Mitra had also written a letter to Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman after the meeting to record his "dissent" against decisions of the council.

No more space for monetary steps, tough task ahead for RBI: SBI Report

As the economy battles yet again to come out of the Covid-induced slowdown, an SBI Ecowrap report has suggested that the space for monetary accommodation is over, and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will face multiple challenges in terms of boosting India's growth rate and stabilising the rupee. The report noted that it is the fiscal policy of the government which will have to pitch in and lift the growth prospects.

"While we do not rule out disruption to Government finances in subsequent months as economic activity only picks up modestly, we believe the space for monetary accommodation is over and only a proactive fiscal policy can rekindle animal spirits and growth," it said.

Consumer anxiety at highest levels, less affluent most skeptical about economic outlook: Study

Consumer anxiety is at the highest levels since the outbreak of coronavirus pandemic in India with the less affluent most skeptical about economic outlook while a majority of consumers think their income in the next six months will be lower than the pre-COVID levels, says a latest study. As per the COVID-19 consumer sentiment research by global management consulting firm Boston Consulting group (BCG) conducted between May 23 and May 28, 2021, covering around 4,000 respondents across metros, tier I, II, III, IV and rural India, 51 per cent of consumers expected their spends over the next six months to be lower. In the last round of survey conducted from July 20 to August 2, 2020, the figure stood at 40 per cent.

RBI proposes to cap borrowers' repayment outgo, scrap lending rate ceiling in uniform microfinance regulations

The Reserve Bank of India has suggested capping the total repayment outflow from a household to half of the annual income of the economically weaker households, which form the target segment for microfinance lenders, as part of a slew of proposals to revamp the regulations on microfinance. RBI said the guidelines will be lender agnostic while it proposed to do away with interest rate cap on microloans, which has so far been applicable only to pure-play microfinance institutions.

Regulators to look into PNB Housing Fin's plan to raise Rs 4,000 cr

Reserve Bank of India as well as Sebi will look into various regulatory issues related to the proposed Rs 4,000 crore-investment by US-based private equity firm Carlyle and others in PNB Housing Finance, sources said on Monday.Last month, the board of PNB Housing Finance cleared a proposal to raise up to Rs 4,000 crore by issuing preference shares and convertible warrants to Carlyle Group firms and other entities.According to the sources, concerns of minority shareholders, corporate governance and others regulatory aspects would be looked into by RBI and Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi).Earlier this year, RBI had shot down a proposal of Punjab National Bank (PNB) to infuse capital into its subsidiary PNB Housing Finance through a rights issue on concerns of the lender's financial health.

Mobile prepaid recharge facility on BBPS by August-end, says RBI

The Reserve Bank of India on Monday said the scope of Bharat Bill Payment System (BBPS) will be expanded by August 31 this year by adding 'mobile prepaid recharges' as a biller category, a move likely to help millions of prepaid phone subscribers in the country. In September 2019, the scope and coverage of BBPS were expanded to include all categories of billers which raise recurring bills (except mobile prepaid recharges) as eligible participants, on a voluntary basis. Before that, the facility of payment of recurring bills through BBPS was available only in five segments -- direct to home (DTH), electricity, gas, telecom and water. "With consistent growth in different biller categories and to facilitate mobile prepaid customers with more options to recharge, it has been decided to permit 'mobile prepaid recharges' as a biller category in BBPS, on a voluntary basis," the RBI said in a circular.

Indian Overseas Bank urges RBI to pull the bank out of PCA framework

State-owned Indian Overseas Bank has urged the Reserve Bank of India to lift business curbs from it placed under the prompt corrective action framework with the lender's annual return on assets turning positive for the first time since 2014. The bank reported Rs 831 crore of annual profit against Rs 8,527 crore loss in the preceding fiscal. ROA for the full year was 0.31% as against a negative 2.95% a year back.

In a meeting with industry on the PLI scheme, he said that the selection of the companies eligible under the scheme will be done in a transparent and time-bound manner. "The interaction was held to take the feedback on the scheme, the application window for which will be open for three months from tomorrow," the commerce and industry ministry said in a statement on Monday.

No big labour crunch at auto, consumer goods companies in second wave

Covid second wave to result in 25% reduced cement offtake in Q1FY22: ICRA

The second wave of Covid-19 has adversely impacted domestic cement production - the all India production declined 35 percent month-on-month in April 2021 and was lower by 4 percent compared to April 2019, said ICRA in its report. With most states imposing lockdowns due to the spread of Covid-19 infections to rural regions, (unlike last year wherein mostly urban areas were impacted), the cement off-take in May 2021 is likely to further decline by 35-40 percent on month-on-month basis. As per ICRA note, the recovery in the rural regions is expected to be gradual. However, the overall pent-up demand is likely to drive the off-take once lockdowns are relaxed.

NGT refuses to quash Environmental Clearance for modernisation of Navlakhi Port in Gujarat

The National Green Tribunal has refused to quash Environmental Clearance (EC) for modernisation of Navlakhi Port that involves mechanisation of the existing facilities and construction of the new jetty by Gujarat Maritime Board. A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice A K Goel said whatever be the past violations, the impugned EC has been granted after due evaluation and following requisite procedure. The green panel said the contention that the port was in existence since 1939, without any impact assessment and that the project proponent had earlier violated the environmental norms cannot be a ground to interfere with the impugned EC.

Reliance Jio, Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea have urged the telecom regulator not to intervene in fixing prepaid tariff validity spans and keep the matter under forbearance, saying any such intervention would be unwarranted and could disrupt and destabilise mobile tariff structures, hurting consumers.

Market leader, Jio, though, has suggested that the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (Trai) issue an advisory calling on telcos to offer at least one prepaid plan voucher (PV), special tariff voucher (STV) and combo voucher (CV) with 30-day validity to address consumer complaints around the 28-day packs.

Bengal eases Covid curbs; offices allowed to function with 25% workforce

The West Bengal administration on Monday allowed government and private offices to function with 25 per cent workforce from June 16, easing some of the restrictions imposed to check the spread of Covid-19 as the situation has improved now, a top official said. Employers have to arrange for transporting employees as restrictions on public transportation services will continue till further orders, Chief Secretary HK Dwivedi said. Shopping malls will be allowed to operate from 11 am to 6 pm while markets can remain open between 7 am and 11 am from Wednesday. Restaurants and bars will be allowed to open from noon to 8 pm with 50 per cent of the seating capacity, Dwivedi said. He said that sports events can be organised inside stadiums with no spectators while parks will be open in the morning only for walkers who are fully vaccinated.

India May palm oil imports nearly doubles, soy oil jumps - trade body

India's palm oil imports nearly doubled in May from last year's low base to the highest level in 4-months as refiners bought aggressively to replenish inventory, a leading trade body said in a statement on Monday. The country's palm oil imports in the month jumped 92% to 769,602 tonnes, while soyoil purchases rose by 43% to 267,781 tonnes, the Solvent Extractors' Association of India (SEA) said in a statement. India's sunflower oil imports rose 31% to 175,759 tonnes in May, it added. The country's imports in May jumped as stocks had depleted after a drop in the imports in the last few months, the SEA said in a statement. India buys palm oil from Indonesia and Malaysia while other oils, including soyoil and sunflower oil, are sourced from Argentina, Brazil, Ukraine and Russia. "Imports would remain elevated even in June as many states are easing lockdowns and allowing restaurants to reopen," said a Mumbai-based dealer with a global trading firm.
