Govt to take 'balanced' approach on e-commerce rules, Consumer Affairs Secretary says

The government will take a "balanced" approach while finalising the amendments proposed to the Consumer Protection (e-commerce) Rules as "wide and varied" comments have been received from stakeholders, a top official said on Tuesday. To protect the interest of consumers, the government has proposed key amendments to the Consumer Protection (e-commerce) Rules, 2020 which include ban on fraudulent flash sales and misselling.

"We have received a lot of suggestions. We will now have to come out with best formulations from the consumer perspective taking into account the wide and varied diverse views received on the draft rules," Consumer Affairs Secretary Leena Nandan told reporters. It would be difficult to give a timeline as many suggestions have come and all of them require deliberations and discussions. But it is certainly work in progress, she said.

Faceless assessment: Rules for authentication of e-records submission eased

The finance ministry on Tuesday said electronic records submitted through registered account of taxpayers in the income tax portal shall be deemed to have been authenticated by the taxpayer by electronic verification code (EVC). The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) amended income tax rules on Monday to ease authentication of records submitted in faceless assessment proceeding. The ministry said the amended rule provides that electronic records submitted through registered account of the taxpayers in the income tax department's portal shall be deemed to have been authenticated by the taxpayer by electronic verification code (EVC).

"Therefore, where a person submits an electronic record by logging into his registered account in designated portal of the income tax department, it shall be deemed that the electronic record has been authenticated by EVC...," it said

Cabinet may approve PLI scheme for MMF, technical textiles on Wednesday

The Union Cabinet is likely to approve on Wednesday a production linked incentive (PLI) scheme for man-made fibre segment and technical textiles with a financial outlay of Rs 10,683 crore over five years to boost domestic manufacturing and exports from the sector, an official said. The proposal is expected to come up before the Union Cabinet meeting on Wednesday, the official added. The Cabinet had earlier approved PLI schemes in 13 key sectors for enhancing India's manufacturing capabilities and exports. After the approval, the textiles ministry would come with detailed guidelines of the scheme for these sectors. The prime objective of the scheme is to make manufacturing in India globally-competitive by removing sectoral disabilities, creating economies of scale and ensuring efficiencies. It is designed to create a complete component ecosystem in India and make India an integral part of the global supply chains.

Niti Aayog VC calls for mitigation strategies to deal with climate change

Niti Aayog Vice Chairman Rajiv Kumar on Tuesday said the very real threat of climate change necessitates the development of mitigation strategies. While the government will extend all possible support to such strategies, without the private sector developing and embracing climate-smart solutions, targets are unlikely to be met, he said in an official statement. Speaking at an event in connection with signing of Statement of Intent (SoI) between Niti Aayog and Gujarat University, Kumar also emphasised the need to develop new business models and solutions across the economy.

"The very real threat of climate change necessitates the development of mitigation strategies. Agriculture and the associated value chain have a crucial role to play in this regard," he said. According to the statement, the SoI focuses on technical collaboration between the two institutions to strengthen knowledge-sharing and policy development in India.

Fitch says India continues to 'lag way behind' in COVID vaccination; rising debt-to-GDP a concern

Fitch Ratings on Tuesday said India continues to "lag way behind" in COVID vaccination, and the negative outlook on sovereign rating signifies the rising debt-to-GDP ratio. In April 2021, Fitch affirmed India's sovereign rating at 'BBB-' with a negative outlook. The outlook was changed to 'negative' from 'stable' in June last year on grounds that the pandemic had significantly weakened the country's growth outlook and exposed the challenges associated with a high public-debt burden. Addressing the Global Sovereign Conference 2021, Asia-Pacific, Fitch Ratings Senior Director, Head of Asia-Pacific Sovereign Ratings, Stephen Schwartz said vaccination is the key to economic recovery across the world.

"The (APAC) region which was so successful in containing the virus early on, got behind the curve when it came to rollout of vaccines. Singapore really stands out now with 80 per cent of its population being vaccinated. But many countries in the region like Vietnam, Thailand and India continue to lag way behind and as a result continue to have periodic restrictions," Schwartz said.

Report not given attention: SC panel member to CJI on farm laws

Third-party apps turn on UPI autopay mode

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) UPI Autopay service, which was launched last year, is gaining traction after a slow start with top merchants such as Netflix and Hotstar signing up. Unified Payments Interface (UPI) apps PhonePe and Google Pay are also in various stages of rollout and testing. The build-up in transaction momentum comes ahead of Reserve Bank of India (RBI) rules for card-based transactions through standing instructions that take effect next month.

Autopay allows users to make recurring transactions below Rs 5,000 through UPI apps. Most of these currently take place through card-based mandates that are more sophisticated, and settlements more expensive. Autopay's likely uses include loan repayments, rent payments, educational fees and subscriptions

Lenders rush to invoke personal guarantees of promoters

Armed with a favourable Supreme Court judgement, the Indian lenders have started invoking the personal guarantees of defaulting promoters by taking action against 56 accounts in the June quarter to invoke guarantees amount worth Rs 8,437 crore. In total, lenders have invoked personal guarantees worth Rs 34,000 crore (see chart) in 201 cases till date. The total debt, which was defaulted by companies, was worth Rs 37,861 crore in these 201 cases

India Ratings maintains stable outlook on banking sector in FY22

(Representational image) Domestic rating agency India Ratings on Tuesday maintained a stable outlook on the banking sector for 2021-22 while it expects an increase in stressed assets in retail and MSME segments by end-March.It estimates gross non-performing assets (GNPA) of the banking sector to be at 8.6 per cent and stressed assets at 10.3 per cent for fiscal 2021-22.

The US's Dow Jones is at second with 35 record closes for the year followed by Germany (31) and Taiwan (28). The Sensex looked set to log its 40th record high on Tuesday, however, ended with marginal losses. With a year-to-date gain of 22 per cent, India is currently the best-performing major market globally. Indian MSMEs planning to step up technology investment, hiring ahead despite third wave fear

Covid-hit micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), which had braved the first and second waves of the pandemic, are looking to step up investment in digital technology along with hiring more people this year and would continue the momentum next year as well, one of the top executives at data analytics and consulting firm Kantar told Financial Express Online in an interaction. While every one out of four MSMEs was looking to increase its employee strength during 2020 but it took a back seat due to Covid. However, towards the end of 2020, at least one out of three MSMEs was looking to increase its staff for the next year and this would continue in the coming year as well, according to Indranil Dutta, Associate Vice President, Insights Division, Kantar.

"Also, while their (MSMEs) investment in digital technology may not be significant in comparison to pre-Covid period, but we may see at least one-third of MSMEs investing in technology by end of this year and next year as well vis-avis only 20 per cent looking at technology-related investments in 2019. We will see this trend continue irrespective of whether there is a third wave or not. There won't be a U-turn in using digital advertisement. Digital will continue to grow," said Dutta.

National Test House to set up facilities to test nanoparticles, toys, ACs this year

The government on Tuesday said the National Test House (NTH) will set up facilities for testing nanoparticles, toys, helmets and air conditioners in the current fiscal. Kolkata-headquartered NTH, set up in 1912 under the then Railway Board, has since grown into a laboratory of national importance in the field of testing and quality evaluation, ensuring the quality of almost all sorts of industrial and consumer products. "About 25,000 samples are tested annually. Even testing is done visiting the physical sites," Consumer Affairs Secretary Leena Nandan told reporters. Passenger vehicle retail sales increase 39% in August: FADA

Automobile dealers' body FADA on Tuesday expressed concern that the chip shortage issue could derail passenger vehicle (PV) retail sales during the festive season, as automakers are struggling with an adequate supply of vehicles to dealers due to production challenges. Terming semiconductor shortage as a "full-blown crisis", the industry body warned of a lacklustre festive season, especially for the passenger vehicle dealer fraternity, with low inventory levels and non-availability of the fast-moving model variants ahead of the peak festive period. "Auto dealers are facing the most challenging phase of their business career as COVID-19 after-effect continues to play spoil-sport. Until last year,

Mumbai airport records nearly 4-fold growth in passenger traffic in August

The onset of the festive season coupled with some countries easing visa and travel curbs helped Mumbai's Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA) to post a nearly four-fold growth in passenger traffic in August. CSMIA handled 16-lakh passengers in August this year, the private airport operator said on Tuesday. Of this, the domestic passenger segment accounted for almost 90 per cent, while international was a little over 10 per cent, amid a ban on scheduled international flight operations from late March 2020, and only a limited number of air services being allowed on overseas routes under various special arrangements and pacts. In August 2020, the country's second busiest airport handled 4-lakh passengers.

Government constitutes task force, expert committee on coal-based hydrogen production

The Centre on Tuesday said it has constituted a task force and expert committee to prepare a road map for coal-based hydrogen production. This is aimed at contributing to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's agenda of a hydrogen-based economy in a clean manner. "Ministry of Coal has constituted 2 Committees today, one to oversee the program and another of experts to give guidance to the Ministry," the coal ministry said in a statement.

The task force has been constituted under the chairmanship of Coal Additional Secretary Vinod Kumar Tiwari. Its broad terms of reference include monitoring of activities towards achieving coal-based hydrogen production and usage and coordination with Coal Gasification Mission and NITI Aayog.

Proposed 27GW coal power plants could jeopardise India's RE goals: Report

The proposed new coal-based power plants totalling 27 GW could "jeopardise" India's target of 450GW renewable energy by 2030, says a report by Ember and Climate Risk Horizons. As per the report, 27 GW of pre-permit and permitted new coal power plant proposals in India are now "superfluous to its electricity requirements". "These coal project proposals could jeopardise the achievement of India's widely-praised RE target of 450 GW by 2030," it said. It said these surplus "zombie" plants - assets that would be neither dead nor alive - would require Rs 247,421 crore (USD 33 billion) of investment, and yet are projected to lie idle or operate at uneconomic capacity factors due to surplus generation capacity in the system.

Kerala govt decides to lift night curfew, withdraw Sunday lockdown

Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan on Tuesday said that it has been decided to forthwith do away with the night curfew and the "stringent intensified" restrictions on Sundays. The move comes as the state on Tuesday reported 25,772 fresh COVID-19 cases. The CM said the decision to do away with restrictions was taken in the COVID review meeting as the TPR in the state, which was around 18.49 per cent in the last week of August, fell to 17.91 in the first week of September.

On Tuesday, the TPR was 15.87 per cent. Vijayan said if people continue to be more vigilant, the number of cases can be brought down. After daily cases rose to more than 30,000 following the Onam celebrations, the state had brought in night curfew from 10pm to 6am from Monday to Saturday to check the increasing numbers.

Centre's nod to Andhra Pradesh to borrow more

The Government of India has given a much-needed breather to the cash-starved Andhra Pradesh government, allowing it to raise Rs 10,500 crore through open market borrowing (OMB) for the first nine months of the ongoing financial year. With this, the total OMB allowed to the state during the current year would be Rs 31,251 crore, the Union Finance Ministry said in a letter to the Reserve Bank of India. The Centre fixed a Net Borrowing Ceiling (NBC) of Rs 42,472 crore for the state for the year 2021-22, with a borrowing space of Rs 37,163 crore for the first nine months. A 'debt statement' prepared by the state Finance Department indicated that a sum of Rs 34,058.80 crore has already been borrowed from April to August this year.

India 'prepares for the worst' ahead of possible Covid third wave

As COVID-19 cases and deaths exploded in India in April and May, New Delhi's premier Sir Ganga Ram Hospital and several others ran so short of oxygen that many patients in the capital suffocated. When Reuters visited the hospital on Friday, its last coronavirus patient was readying to leave after recovery - a remarkable turnaround health experts attribute to growing levels of immunity from natural infection and vaccinations. But hospitals have learned from bitter experience during the second COVID wave, when funeral pyres burned non-stop and bodies littered the banks of the holy Ganges river, as India braces for another possible surge in infections around its September-November festival season. Beds have been added at facilities around the country, and hospitals are working to ensure ample supplies of oxygen.

Covid-19 may not impair lung function in young adults, research shows

COVID-19 infection does not appear to impair the lung function of children and adolescents, according to a study presented at the virtual European Respiratory Society International Congress on Tuesday. A team led by researchers at the Karolinska Institute, Sweden, found that even patients with asthma did not show a statistically significant deterioration in lung function. However, such patients showed slightly lower measurements for the amount of air they could exhale forcibly in one second known as forced expiratory air volume in one second (FEV1), which is one of the measures of lung function. A second study presented at the conference on Sunday showed that the lung function in children and adolescents was also unimpaired after COVID-19 infection, apart from those who experienced a severe infection.

Commerce Ministry recommends anti-dumping duty on Vitamin C from China for 5 years

The commerce ministry's investigation arm DGTR has recommended the imposition of anti-dumping duty on Vitamin C, used by pharmaceutical firms for medicine production, from China to guard domestic manufacturers from cheap imports. The Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) has concluded in its probe that the imports from China are entering the domestic market at price below the level of the selling price, and even the cost of sales. The domestic industry has been impacted due to the dumped imports, DGTR has said in a notification.

"Accordingly, definitive anti-dumping duty...is recommended to be imposed for five years from the date of the notification to be issued by the Central Government, on all imports of goods...originating in or exported from China,"

it added. The DGTR has recommended USD 3.2 per kg and USD 3.55 per kg duty on imports. The finance ministry takes the final decision to impose the duty.

As masoor prices hit record high, India opens lentil imports from Russia for a period of 6 months

The government has, for the first time, allowed import of lentils (masur) from Russia with a view to reducing dependence on Canada and Australia for the commodity. The move has helped bring down the price of imported masur by 2.5% at the ports. Masur prices in India are at a record high. On Tuesday, whole masur in wholesale trade was available at Rs 80/kg, while in retail, masur dal was available at Rs 100/kg.

Export body seeks SEZ inclusion in duty remission scheme

The Export Promotion Council for EOUs and SEZs (EPCES) on Tuesday sought the benefits of the Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) scheme to be extended to special economic zones and also urged the government to allow them to sell goods in the domestic tariff area. "We have submitted a proposal before the government to cover SEZs and EOUs too under the new RoDTEP scheme," said EPCES chairman Bhuvnesh Seth, adding that the government has assured that a committee is being set up to look at the issue.

India, Kazakhstan carry out 5th edition of joint military drills KAZIND-21

India and Kazakhstan carried out the 5th edition of the annual bilateral joint exercise KAZIND-21 strengthing military diplomacy between the two countries. "Troops of India and Kazakhstan carrying out the demonstration of a raid on a terrorist hideout during the joint military exercise KAZIND-21 at Training Node Aisha Bibi, Kazakhstan," tweeted Indian Army. As part of military diplomacy and to strengthen the growing strategic relation with Kazakhstan, the 5th "KAZIND-21" is conducted in Kazakhstan from August 30 to September 11. The exercise is a joint training between both the Armies, which will boost the bilateral relations between India and Kazakhstan.

The Indian Army contingent was represented by a battalion of The Bihar Regiment consisting of a total of 90 personnel led by a Contingent Commander. The Kazakhstan Army was represented by a company group.

Jewellery export council suggests introduction of repair policy, cut in import duty

The Gems and Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC) has suggested for introduction of a repair policy; cut in import duty on gold and silver; and the abolition of equalisation levy of 2 per cent for purchase of rough diamonds with a view to promoting the growth of the sector. These issues among others were raised during an interactive session with members of GJEPC and Commerce Secretary B V R Subrahmanyam in Mumbai on September 4.Colin Shah, Chairman, GJEPC expressed confidence that with the support of the government, the sector will achieve its target of USD 70 billion in the coming years.

"I am confident that most of the sectoral issues raised today will be resolved when we meet the Commerce Secretary again after six months," he said in a statement. During the interaction, a range of points were covered including GST, issues related to the RBI and customs. "With regards to the jewellery, the concerns raised by the exporters included the introduction of repair policy in foreign trade policy; duty drawback rates to be at par with prevailing import duty; a hand- carriage of gems and jewellery to be allowed in other ports like Mumbai, Kolkata; reduction in import duty on gold and silver from 7.5 per cent to 4 per cent," the council said.
